The aim of the RHYME research project is to understand the mechanisms that underly age differences in episodic and working memory from childhood to older adulthood. In our projects, experimental and training studies are combined with neuroimaging methods including EEG, and structural and functional MRI.

We are looking for one reliable and responsible student of psychology, neuroscience, or related subject to join the ECHO (Early Childhood Memories) project for a minimum of three months. The ECHO project looks at memory development between the age of 1.5–3 years of age. Requirements are native German speakers, advanced English language skills, and interest in neurocognitive developmental psychology.

We are looking for a student to work on data collection and data analysis. Methodological experience (Matlab, R, Python, SPSS) is beneficial.

Internships in our project enable students to gain experience in the preparation and realization of EEG studies and analysis of data in developmental psychology. Interns work on defined tasks that are part of our ongoing research projects and will be supervised by scientific staff.

The reimbursement will be 430 EUR per month.

The earliest start date is Nov 1, 2022 or later.
